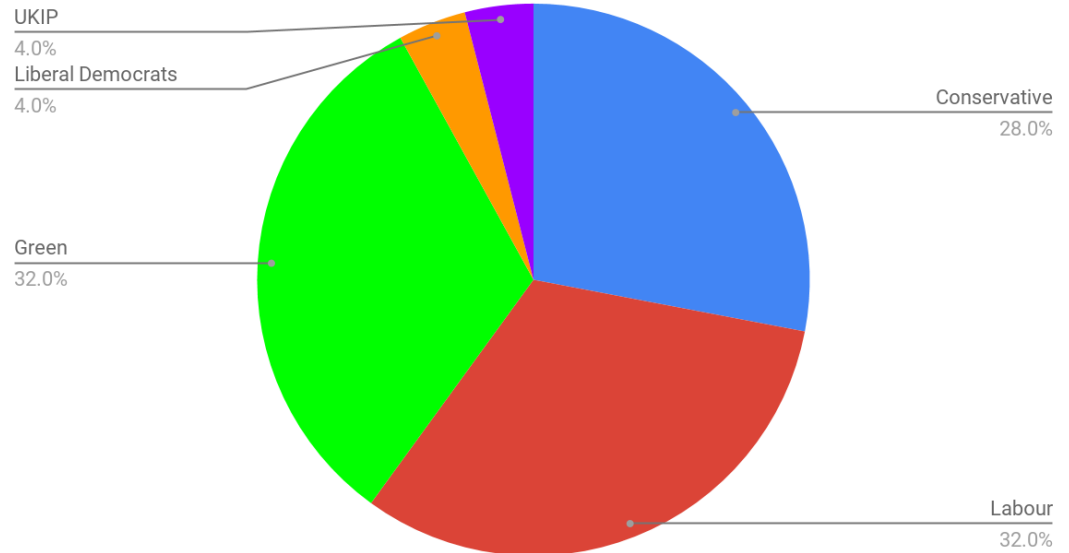

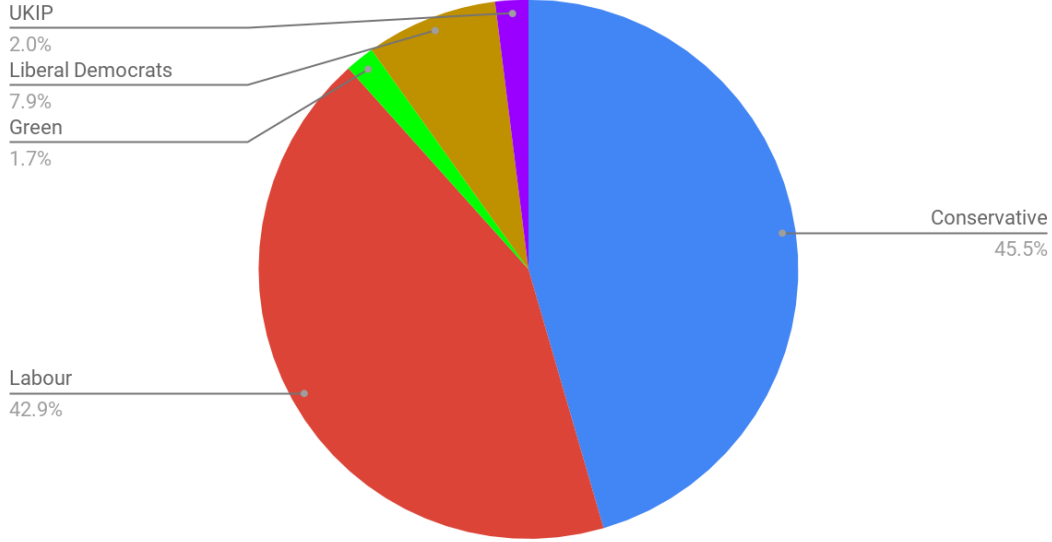

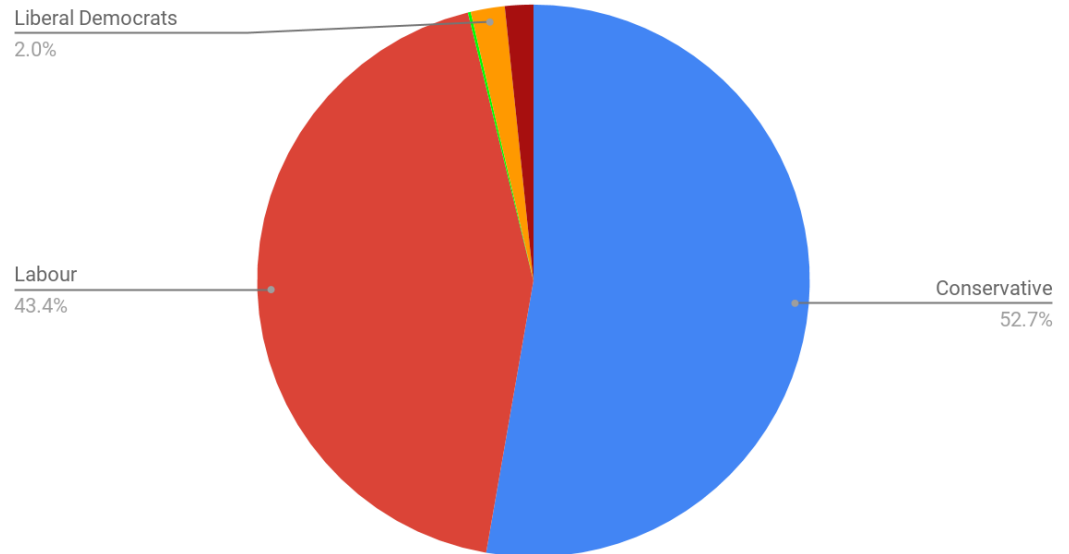
## Vote share

# How Toynbee voted

In Toynbee Elects, Labour won the most votes with 168 and tied with Green for most seats at 8. However the Conservatives received more votes than the Greens but got fewer seats, 133 Conservative votes for 7 seats and 128 Green votes for 8.

In the tutor 8PT, the Conservatives and Labour were tied for votes and so, as they do if this actually happens, the votes were recounted and a coin was flipped which gave Labour the tutor/seat.

A government is formed by a party with more than half the seats, but since no party had the required number of 13, a coalition must be formed between two or more parties; in this case, Labour and Green could do this for a total of 16 seats.

# Toynbee vs the country

In the real election, the votes resulted similarly in a position where no party had the required 326 / 650 seats to form a government, so the Conservatives and the DUP (a Northern Irish party - the Democratic Unionist Party) joined together to govern with 328 seats between them.

In Toynbee, the Green party was very popular gaining 23% of the votes and 32% of the seats but in the real general election, they only managed 1.7% of the votes, and just one seat. Furthermore, Labour, despite seeing more votes and seats than the Conservatives in Toynbee, lost the election in the country and can not form a government.

The voters in Toynbee favoured left-wing parties vs the more right-wing UK voters.
