PSCHE Practitioner – Responsible for delivering Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSCHE) content to all year groups, classes and bespoke groups of pupils.

The PSCHE Curriculum:

The PSHCE curriculum at Toynbee is designed to embed fundamental cultural capital that will allow pupils to think critically about the world and prepare them for adulthood. At Toynbee we give young pupils the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

The PSHCE curriculum delivers lessons covering important topics such as; Relationships and Sex Education Personal Identity Healthy Living Safety Education Finance Citizenship.

All pupils, from Year 7 to 11 are taught the PSHCE curriculum through lessons, assemblies, tutor sessions and specific off-timetable theme afternoons.

We are committed to expanding our PSHCE provision to meet the changing needs of our pupils. We are planning on reintroducing our successful Personal Development Learning days (PDL) days from September 2022 and we are looking to continue to foster strong links with our parental community through the delivery of parent workshops around PSHCE themes.

The PSHCE Practitioner will be responsible to

- 1. Headteacher
- 2. Senior Leadership Team
- 3. PSCHE/Careers Coordinator

Job Purpose:

To deliver Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSCHE) content to all year groups, classes and bespoke groups of pupils. This would also extend to communication with Parents and carers regarding the provision of PSCHE and how best to support their children.

Profile and Responsibilities:

1. Curriculum

- Deliver PSHCE Lessons to all year groups, including:
 - \circ $\;$ The careful planning and preparation of lessons
 - Maintaining a good order and discipline amongst pupils whilst maintaining the highest standards of care and courtesy.
- Work alongside the PSHCE/Careers Coordinator to develop the PSHCE curriculum and lessons.
- Maintain an up to date understanding of all matters relating to PSHCE, including relevant contextual safeguarding issues and local/national priorities

2. Beyond the Curriculum

• Undertake and develop a weekly session of the tutor programme dedicated to Personal Development (eg SMSC/Citizenship/British Values) alongside the PSHCE Head of Department.

- Deliver regular assemblies on relevant PSHCE themes to all year groups.
- Organise and deliver off timetable PDL (Personal Development Learning) sessions focused on specific PSHCE themes.
- Work with key groups of pupils in a proactive and supportive manner on specific Personal Development issues, as needs arise. This may relate to issues such safeguarding, bullying, drug misuse or any other relevant topics.
- Create and analyse pupil surveys, helping to identify arising next steps.
- Work directly with the Head of department to foster links with external providers.
- Organise and deliver Parent workshops.

3. Other duties

- Make a full and substantial contribution to wider whole school activities related to Personal Development. This would include relevant enrichment and extra curricular activities, breakfast and lunchtime clubs and any other opportunities as identified by SLT.
- Take part in further training and continued professional development as appropriate.
- Make a reasonable contribution to the general duties of the school and cover of absent colleagues in accordance with generally accepted policies.
- Attend Parents Evenings and other school events, as appropriate.
- Respond to any safeguarding incidents in line with the Toynbee Safeguarding and Child Protection Policies.
- Attend Toynbee Safeguarding Meetings and other meeting as appropriate.
- Contribute to wider whole school activities related to personal development.

The person undertaking the role is expected to work within the policies, ethos and aims of the school and to carry out such other duties as may reasonably be assigned by the Headteacher.
