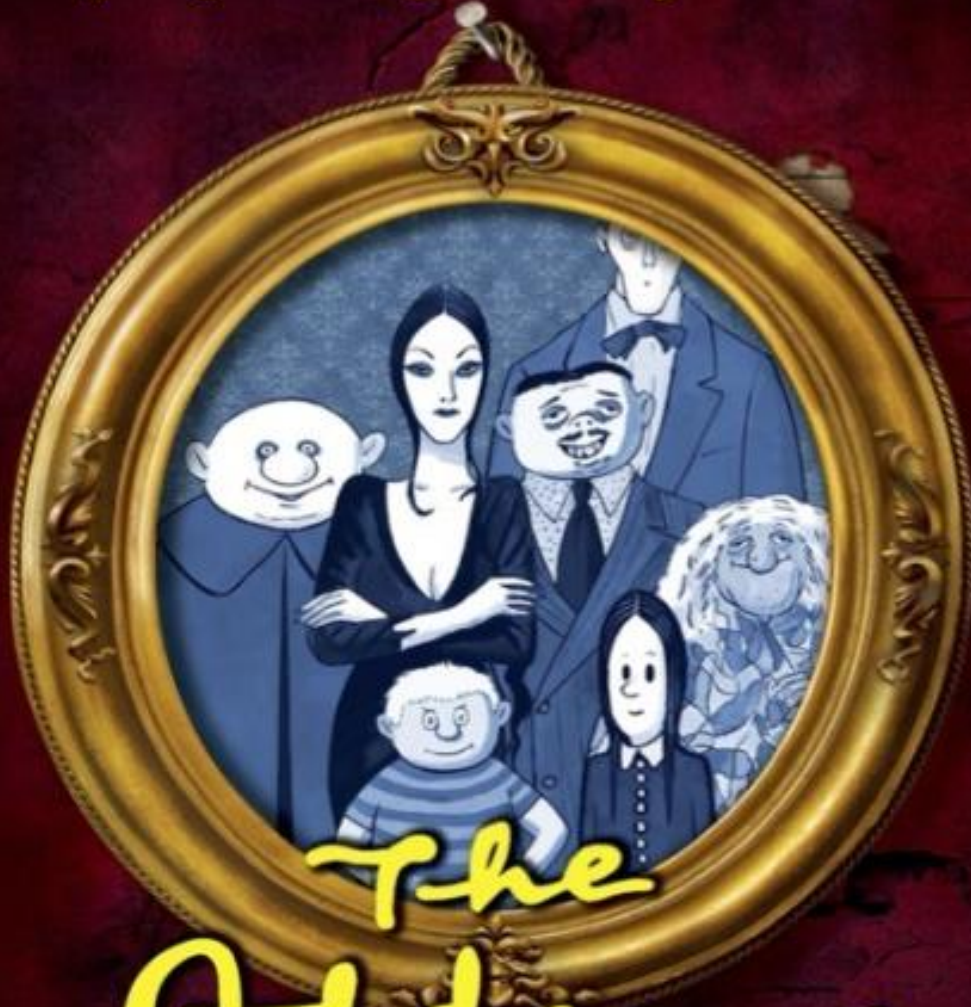

New Vision Parenting (NVR Hampshire)

Are pleased to offer an NVR online workshop:

An introduction to Sensory Processing Difficulties and how it can affect behaviour

In this 2 hour workshop we will explore how sensory processing difficulties/disorder might present itself in each of the senses, including the 3 lesser known senses.

We will explore some of the behaviour responses which often go hand in hand when sensory information becomes overwhelming for a young person. We will look at parental/carer responses to these behaviours and explore accommodation Vs. coping methods.
